# PhD Student well-being & Psychological Support:



Doing a PhD is not easy, it comes with a lot of changes in your private and personal life, and we all cope with it differently. Seeking help is therefore not something to be ashamed of, and is something you should consider if you're feeling lost or like you've hit a wall.

We are very pleased that from now on, the VDSEE is able to offer professional psychological support during your PhD studies, free of charge, in both English and German. Psychotherapist <u>Dr. Markus Böckle</u> holds a PhD and is also working as lecturer, therefore he knows how academia works and the kinds of problems that often arise in this context.

### What is offered?

We offer group sessions and individual sessions, but can also provide you with support if you need a mediator with e.g. your supervisor(s). The group sessions are going to happen

together with other PhD students - we often struggle with the same issues, and it might already help to see that you're not alone with it. Look out for Antonia's emails regarding the registration for the next group session, they are going to happen every semester. For individual sessions, we're able to provide you with one session free of charge during your PhD studies, possible at any time.

#### Who is eligible?

The offer is open for all students that are part of the VDSEE, regardless if a working contract with the university exists or not!

#### How does it work?

Simply reach out to Antonia via email (antonia.vogel@univie.ac.at), outlining your circumstances and specifying the type of support you need. All of this is of course strictly confidential, and you also do not have to go into detail why you need support, just that you are in need. However, the more details you provide (points like "stress managing", "anxiety" are absolutely enough), the better the psychotherapist will be able to prepare and help you.


#### **New Faces**

# **Travel grant**

The VDSEE travel grant budget for 2024 is almost fully allocated. If you plan to attend a conference this year and want to <u>apply</u> for a travel grant, please send your application until **7 May 2024**.

# **VDSEE Completion grant**

The next call <u>completion grant</u> call will open from **17 May - 14 June 2024**. PhD-candidates that are very close to finishing can apply for a 4-month PraeDoc-contract funded by the VDSEE.

Possible starting dates: 1 August, 15 August, 1 September 2024 After 4 months thesis submission is expected.
